Aaron Marcoux called the meeting to order at 7:34 a.m.

Motion by Schlender, 2nd by McCoy, to approve the minutes of the April 8, 2019 meeting. Motion carried

Criminal Justice Coordinator Diane McNamer updated the Council on diversion programs including the cooking class for inmates and Prime for Life. The second Prime for Life will be held June 5 & 6. McNamer introduced Michael Noel from Precision Kiosk Technologies. Mr. Noel demonstrated the ABT Kiosk. The kiosk is capable of processing 40 tests per hour and accepts cash or credit card. Individuals can be preloaded into the kiosk or self-register at the time of testing. Various options for testing ranging from 1-2 tests per month to twice every day. Different entities can have separate administrative logins. No set up fee. Usage fee should cover monthly lease amount. The ABT Kiosk will be on the June agenda for more discussion and possible action.

Lieutenant Joe Sajdera reported seven inmates out on electronic monitoring and working on two more.

McNamer and Marcoux reported on bond testing. The District Attorney's Office requests the court to order reimbursement of the cost of testing if the offenders tampers with the patch.

Proposal regarding new law for 4th and higher OWI offenses on June agenda. Also, discussion on pursuing both drug and OWI cases when applicable.

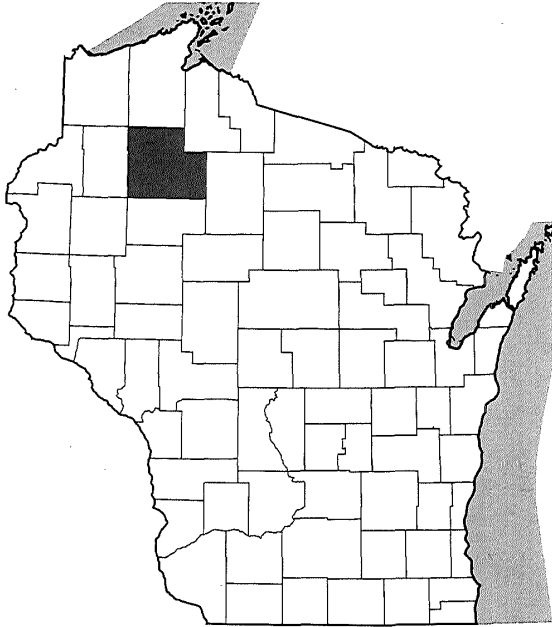

PROGRAM DETAILS

INDIVIDUALS ARE REQUIRED , PER THEIR BAIL BOND CONDITIONS, TO CONTACT THE CRIMINAL JUSTICE COORDINATOR WITHIN 24 HOURS OF THEIR RELEASE TO SET UP ORDERED BOND TESTING AND/OR LEARN ABOUT THE STOP PROGRAM AS IT APPLIES TO THEIR OFFENSE. STOP IS AN ACRONYM FOR THE SAWYER COUNTY TRAFFIC OFFENDER PROGRAM.

WHAT IS STOP?

THERE ARE 3 LEVELS OF STOP

LEVEL 1: COURT ORDERED SUPERVISION PROGRAM DESIGNED TO MONITOR BOND CONDITIONS OF PRETRIAL DEFENDANTS (EITHER RANDOM OR DAILY) WHO HAVE BEEN CHARGED WITH TWO OR MORE OWI'S.

LEVEL 2: IS A VOLUNTARY INTENSIVE SUPERVISION PROGRAM THAT HAS A COST TO ENROLL INTO. SUCCESSFUL COMPLETION WILL FIND SOMEONE ELIGIBLE TO SERVE THEIR SENTENCE THROUGH AN ELECTRONIC MONITORING SYSTEM IN LIEU OF SERVING JAIL TIME .

Level 3: Home detention for the sentence is done via the home monitor that allows someone out of home for work or medical appointments only. Either a land line or active cell service at home is required for the monitor. There is a cost of \$20/day and the monitor cost MUST paid in full by end of sentence.

What is required of me in Level 2?

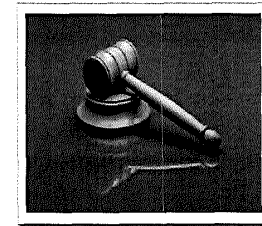
You must enroll into STOP II at a cost of \$200 for a second OWI or if a third the cost is \$250.

1. All monies must be paid at the time of the enrollment. This amount is non- refundable if you fail to follow through with the requirements of the program.
2. You must first have an OWI assessment done in the county you reside in. If a Sawyer County resident you can have the assessment done at Sawyer County Health and Human Services (\$250) or if a tribal member you can have it done at LCO Health and Human Services (\$150).
3. You must complete the Department of Transportation assessment and recommended driver safety plan required for licensing.
4. Attend a Victim Impact Panel (\$50).
5. Compliance on all Daily or Random testing as so designated by the court until final disposition of your case.

Note: Any non compliance with your bail bond will be reported to the court and a bond hearing will be held. The court may modify your bond at that time and you may be found no longer eligible for the STOP program and its benefits.

This program is designed so that all the orders from the court at sentencing regarding compliance with the DMV, such as the OWI assessment, follow through and completion of your drivers safety plan plus attendance to a Victim Impact Panel will be done prior to sentencing. By doing this program it may potentially reduce the penalty for your OWI.

This is a voluntary program and it shows the court and the District Attorney's office that you completed everything you will be ordered to do upfront and as such can be found eligible for electronic monitoring in lieu of jail time.



Note: Failure to comply with the Level III program will result in immediately being removed from the monitor to serve the remainder of your sentence in jail with possible loss of good time.

WHO IS ELIGIBLE FOR THE PROGRAM?

- Persons with a 4th, 5th or 6th pending OWI in Sawyer County that have not been charged with an OWI within 3 years of their last offense
- Persons without violent offenses
- Persons who would be open to changing alcohol and drug behaviors
- Persons who are available to complete program requirements

WHY PARTICIPATE ?

- To potentially reduce penalties for OWI
- To increase personal growth
- To change unwanted behaviors

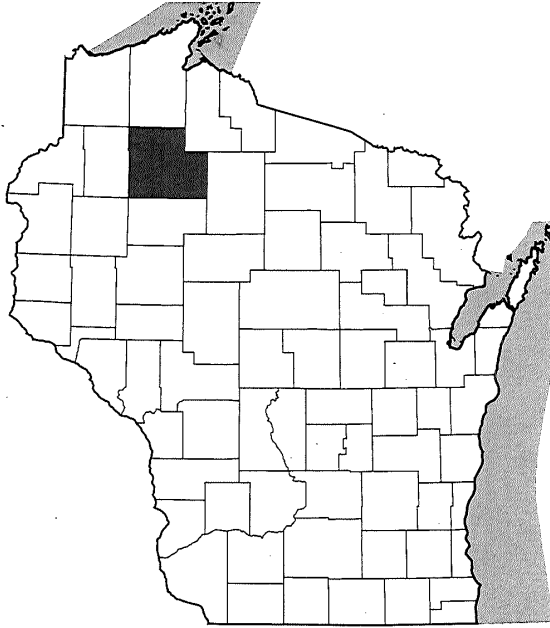

PROGRAM DETAILS

INDIVIDUALS ARE REQUIRED, PER THEIR BAIL BOND CONDITIONS, TO CONTACT THE CRIMINAL JUSTICE COORDINATOR WITHIN 24 HOURS OF THEIR RELEASE TO SET UP ORDERED BOND TESTING AND/OR LEARN ABOUT THE STOP PROGRAM AS IT APPLIES TO THEIR OFFENSE. STOP IS AN ACRONYM FOR THE SAWYER COUNTY TRAFFIC OFFENDER PROGRAM.

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Level 3: Home detention for the sentence is done via the home monitor that allows someone out of home for work or medical appointments only. Either a land line or active cell service at home is required for the monitor. There is a cost of \$20/day with a \$25 install fee.

What is required of me in Level 2?

You must enroll into STOP II at a cost of \$450 for a charged 4th OWI or above

1. All monies must be paid at the time of the enrollment. This amount is non-refundable if you fail to follow through with the requirements of the program.
2. You must have an AODA assessment done in the county you reside in. If a Sawyer County resident you can have the assessment done at Sawyer County Health and Human Services or if a tribal member you can have it done at LCO Health and Human Services.
3. You must follow through with the assessment recommendations and provide proof of completion of any AODA counseling or program.
4. Compliance on all Daily or Random testing as so designated by the court until final disposition of your case.

Note: Any non compliance with your bail bond will be reported to the court and a bond hearing will be held. The court may modify your bond at that time and you may be found no longer eligible for the STOP program and its benefits.

This is a voluntary program and it shows the court and the District Attorney's office that you completed everything you are able to do upfront and as such may be found eligible for electronic monitoring and/or potentially reduce the penalty for your OWI.

No good time will be given for these high level OWI offenses. The full sentence will either be served in the county jail or will be allowed home detention via the electronic monitor. All costs for the monitor **MUST** be paid in full each month for the duration of the sentence.

Note: if allowed on home detention any failure to comply with the Level III program will result in immediately being removed from the monitor to serve the remainder of the sentence in jail.
